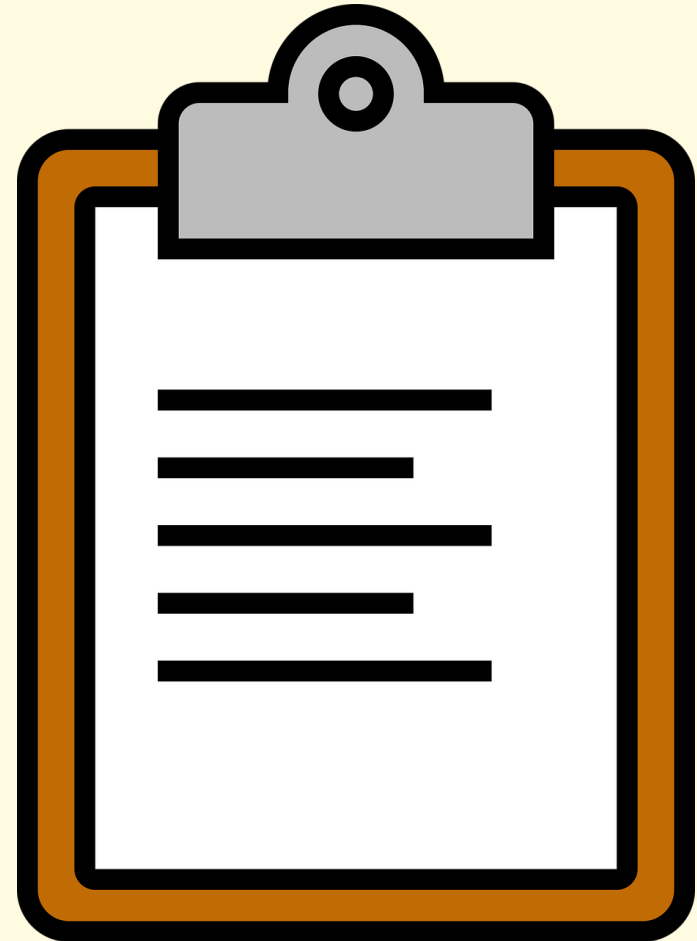

Plagiarism

- Claiming someone else's ideas as your own
- Improper citation
- Self-plagiarism (submitting own older works)
- Improper paraphrasing
- Copying the works of others

Bidens 1987 case of Plagiarism

- Kinnoek: “Why am I the first Kinnoek in a thousand generations to be able to get to university? [Pointing to his wife in the audience:] Why is Glenys the first woman in her family in a thousand generations to be able to get to university? Was it because all our predecessors were thick?”
- Biden: “I started thinking as I was coming over here, why is it that Joe Biden is the first in his family ever to go to a university? [Pointing to his wife in the audience:] Why is it that my wife who is sitting out there in the audience is the first in her family to ever go to college? Is it because our fathers and mothers were not bright? Is it because I’m the first Biden in a thousand generations to get a college and a graduate degree that I was smarter than the rest?”

Cheating

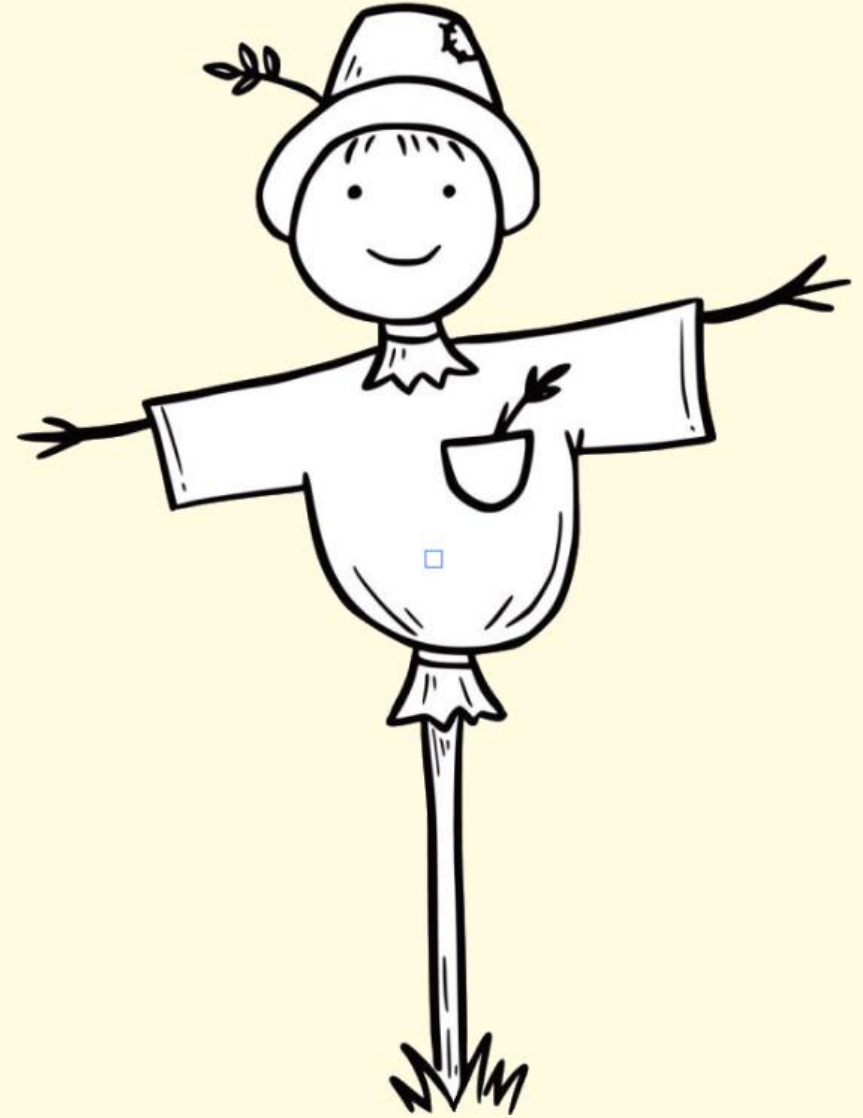
- Having someone write under your name
